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Getting Involved!

You may be asking yourself: How can I become more involved in my neighborhood Association? There are many ways, both big and small that can help make a big difference. The first is by **paying your dues**. This small contribution is essential for the continuation of the organization and its activities. The second is through **attending and/or helping to set up or break down Association meetings**, held on the fourth Thursday of every month at Homewood Park Recreation Center. By attending meetings you can meet your neighbors, learn about neighborhood events and about your neighborhood. A third way to get involved is by **attending neighborhood events** such as the neighborhood Earth Day Celebration in March and the National Night Out in August. A fourth way is by **contributing content and time to the Newsletter**. If you have an article you would like to write, would like to help translating the Newsletter into another language or would like to write a letter to the Editor, please email the Board! A fifth way is by volunteering your time and serving as a block captain or on a committee. **Serving as a block captain** is a relatively small time -commitment which involves

getting to know your neighbors on your block, handing out the Newsletter each quarter, and acting as a liaison between your neighbors and the Board whenever necessary. This is a vital role which also serves to help keep the neighborhood safe. Knowing your neighbors and keeping an eye on them is essential to deterring criminals from committing crimes. There are also several committees which you could head or on which you can serve. These include: **website design and administration, Audit Committee, Neighborhood Watch Committee, Emergency Liaison Chief, or Montgomery County Public School Liaison**.
