

Renew Montgomery Coming to a Neighborhood Near

According to the Montgomery County website (www.montgomerycountymd.gov) the goals of the Renew Montgomery Program will be to: "repair or replace existing sidewalks, curbs and gutters, pave neighborhood streets, implement traffic calming measures, install or improve street lighting, ensure efficient solid waste services, [and] trim tree limbs and foliage."

In recent communications with Tom Pogue, Community Relations Manager with the Montgomery County Department of Transportation, and his colleagues, we have been informed that our area is slated to have work done beginning in September. This will be an approximately four year project which will begin North of Plyers Mill Road close to University Blvd. and move its' way southward culminating near the Beltway. No one area should be affected for more than a couple of weeks at a time.


